ADRION Thematic Cluster no.2 Coastal and Marine Environment management activities

2nd Meeting Online 18/06/2020 - Minutes

Background:

Within the Interreg ADRION program, a capitalization activity was promoted aiming:

- to make the knowledge and results generated by projects, the so called “ADRION Capital”, widely accessible;
- to increase the impact of project results by promoting their re-use and transfer;
- to help build know how in the Adriatic Ionian region by raising awareness and improving communication of results in specific fields at local, regional and national level
- to enhance the program’s impacts and future positioning
- and finally, to increase project results’ visibility and dissemination

Meeting objective and summary:

The 2nd Online Cluster Meeting (18/06/2020) had the objectives to:

- collect from stakeholders information on needs and gaps for a sustainable management of the marine environment;
- strengthen science - policy dialogue;
- start engaging new ADRION projects to improve tackling EUSAIR challenges and strengthen collaborations

The Cluster meeting started out with a short introduction from Olga Sedioli (PORTODIMARE Coordinator) of the ADRION Thematic Cluster no.2. Olga Sedioli briefly presented some basic information on this cluster and what it hopes to achieve. Following this introduction there was a short presentation of everyone attending (Tour de Table) and after that, the presentations of the 3 programs which comprise the cluster (PORTODIMARE, HarmoNIA, IMPRECO) began. All three projects were presented by their coordinators (Olga Sedioli, Marina Lipizer and Massimiliano Pinat) in detail. Following these presentations, Marina Lipizer presented the results of the comparative analysis which took place concerning the three programs. All three programs were briefly presented and the next steps that need to be taken within each project were also mentioned. Olga Sedioli continued with a presentation on the contribution of these programs to EUSAIR. Marina Lipizer summed up and then gave the floor to Cosimo Solidoro (Director of Oceanography, OGS) that introduced the new initiative ‘SHAREMED’. Finally, following the ‘SHAREMED’ presentation a dialogue took place amongst all participants, concerning the gaps and needs in order to move forward towards a sustainable management of the marine environment.

Questions - Comments raised:

All questions and comments occurred during the dialogue which followed the presentation by Cosimo Solidoro, OGS Lead Partner of the new Governance Project 'SHAREMED', supported by Interreg MED Programme.

Q (Marina Lipizer, HarmonIA Coordinator): What are the gaps that need to be filled in order to move forward? What are the bottlenecks towards sustainable management in the marine environment?

A (Cosimo Solidoro, OGS): There seem to be many challenges and things to accomplish - there is still a lot of fragmentation and duplication which needs to be tackled. For example, the various geoportals produced from all programs are considered to be examples of fragmentation- uniting all data into a singular geoportal is an important step to be made. Spatial challenges are also of importance. For example, targeting large features requires the cooperation of many authorities. **Marina Lipizer (HarmonIA Coordinator, OGS)** agreed that scale in general is a problem since different scales require different authorities (from local to national and international). **Cosimo Solidoro (OGS):** Another important gap that needs to be filled concerns knowledge on ecosystem functioning since little is known so far.

Q (Marina Lipizer, HarmonIA Coordinator to the coordinators of the new project SeaViews): Can you introduce the new project, SeaViews?

A (Eirini Stamatopoulou, Nikos Ventikos, NTUA): The aim of the project is to measure oil pollution (oil spills, dark and grey waters) in maritime activities and in domestic waste with the use of various sensors, taking into account the differences between the Mediterranean and the North of Europe. The sensors will be located in ports and mounted on vessels in the Adriatic and the Ionian seas, .

Q (Marina Lipizer, HarmonIA Coordinator): Will there be development of new sensors?

A (Nikos Ventikos, NTUA): The sensors will be bought and then parameterized.

Q (Marina Lipizer to Olga Sedioli, PORTODIMARE Coordinator): What are our expectations on the outcomes of all these projects (HarmonIA, PORTODIMARE, IMPRECO)?

A: A comment was made by **Massimiliano Pinat (IMPRECO Coordinator)** in terms of scale. Working on small scales would give the opportunity to get in touch with other stakeholders. For example, IMPRECO was an interesting project in this sense since it developed the management of various local protected areas and therefore gave the opportunity to the participants to work with people on small scales.

Q (Marina Lipizer, HarmonIA Coordinator): Does this mean that the approach used for a smaller scale can be transported to a higher scale?

A (Massimiliano Pinat, IMPRECO Coordinator): This approach could be connected to other larger scales. Participants were invited to discuss (in IMPRECO) and learned how to manage conflicts. Community based approaches take a very long time.

(Francesca Visintin, IMPRECO partner): The scale of the project is strictly related to the scale of the stakeholders and the activity they are involved in.

(Marina Lipizer, HarmonIA Coordinator): This could be relative to 'SHAREMED', already having the community.

(Cosimo Solidoro, OGS): It is interesting, but very challenging. It is important to work on the local scale, but it is not easy to upscale. However, the capability to earn people's trust and their engagement is very important.

Q (Celia Vassilopoulou, HCMR): It is very important to have an idea on how the results from all these projects are going to be fed. It would also be an added value to know what the plans are in order to avoid fragmentation and duplication and to focus on the integration of the results

A (Marina Lipizer, HarmonIA Coordinator): We are trying to understand how to work and how to perform this capitalization of the results. In terms of how the results are going to be communicated we are going to try and provide as many results and have them used in future projects. The answer isn't clear however and this proves to be the challenge in the capitalization process. **(Olga Sedioli, PORTODIMARE Coordinator)** There wasn't much indication on how to proceed with this capitalization. The idea is to use a roadmap and make an effort in organizing how these results can be fed or even feed other projects. The second issue concerns the stakeholders. There is a need to deepen the work on how these projects impact governance and management. There is a need to think macroregionally without forgetting the local needs. These seem to be the main challenges for the Cluster.

(Giordano Giorgi, ISPRA): We should take into account that legislation isn't sound yet and that thresholds need to be established.

Q (Celia Vassilopoulou, HCMR): How far can scientists go with their results? How happy are we with our knowledge? Can we assess a degree of uncertainty?

A (Marina Lipizer, Olga Sedioli-PORTODIMARE Coordinator): We have to couple monitoring with modelling. Synergies from different fields are needed in order to persuade stakeholders. Our weak points need to be acknowledged in order to work for the future. SWOT analysis has been performed since we have to understand how far we have gone and if we are happy or not.

(Celia Vassilopoulou, HCMR): SWOT analysis is really important. Especially for the capitalization. Finding weaknesses and strengths as well as planning for the future should be our main focus in the meantime.

Meeting Highlight: *'Building trust. The capability to engage people, the local community, and get them to trust you is extremely important'* Cosimo Solidoro, OGS

Meeting conclusion and next steps:

During this second capitalization meeting focus was given on the next steps that need to be taken in order to ensure that the results and all the knowledge gained from the three projects is sustained and passed on to future projects. It was agreed by all participants that there is still a lot of work to be done in order to understand how far we have gone. In the meantime, the goal is to find all weaknesses and strengths in order to prepare for future work.
